GRILLED CORN WITH HONEY BUTTER & SMOKED SALT



INGREDIENTS

- 6 Pieces corn, husked
- 2 Tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 Cup butter, room temperature
- 1/2 Cup honey
- 1 Tablespoon Jacobsen Salt Co. Cherrywood Smoked Salt
- 1 Teaspoon black pepper

STEPS

When ready to cook, set temperature to High and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.

Brush corn with oil and grill, turning occasionally. After about 10 min corn should be cooked through and slightly charred on the outside.

In the bowl of a stand mixer whip butter and honey together 1 minute until light and airy.

Remove from bowl and brush on warm corn. Top with pepper and Jacobson smoked salt and Enjoy!

GOOD NEWS FOR ANSLEY RESIDENTS!! Orin Clinger has recently purchased the compost site and is willing to enter into an agreement with the Village for continued use of the site by Ansley residents for trees and compost materials. **NO LUMBER OF ANY TYPE WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SITE!** The only materials that will be acceptable are trees and branches on the burn pile; leaves, grass, garden waste, dog waste and cat litter on the compost pile. These are the only allowed materials in accordance with the Village's permit for the site.

The Department of Energy and Environment (formerly DEQ) is becoming stricter in their regulation of these sites and the Village is subject to a \$10,000 per day fine for not following the parameters of the permit. In other words, if they do a spot check on the site and find lumber, tires, carpet, or any other items not specifically allowed, even if the site is not burning, they will close the site immediately, can impose the fine, and require proof of proper disposal of the illegal items. This has happened on 2 prior occasions, but a fine has not been imposed yet. The \$6.00 per year residents pay for having the site available to use properly would in no way cover a fine. That would have to be assessed back to the taxpayers of Ansley. Hopefully having this information will prompt citizens to use the site properly. Also, if citizens see misuse of improper materials being dumped, they will report it so a citation can be issued to the offending party.

Your cooperation is important and necessary for continued availability of the site and to protect against the possibility of a hefty fine. Also, if you see Orin Clinger you might want to thank him for his generosity in stepping up to purchase the tract and agreeing to continue making it available to Ansley residents!

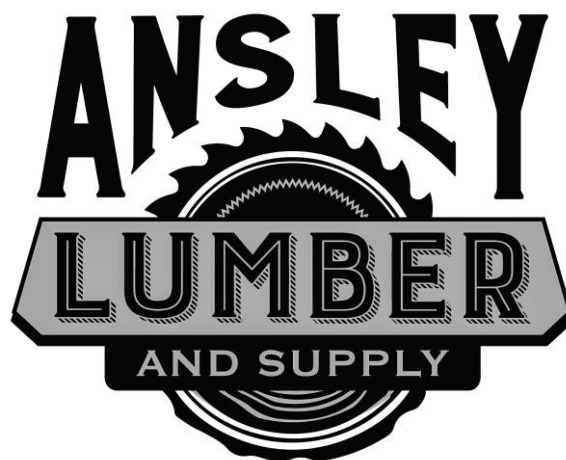

A-L Spartans vs. A-M Coyotes- Thursday, August 27th in Merna

Spartan Football Players- please turn your list of 6 fans (per player) into the school office for the A-M football game, no later than Tuesday, August 25th.

These guidelines and restrictions will be in effect for the fall sports season. The restrictions will be unique to different scenarios and sports. Restrictions for the following sports are:

Football

-Home and visiting schools will be restricted to immediate family and/or step family plus two additional fans for each member of the team (each athlete). Each visiting team will follow the same guidelines, with the school's administrator to enforce this policy. These restrictions will apply to all Junior High, Junior Varsity, and Varsity games this 2020 fall season.

-Visiting fans will be provided their own restrooms and concession stand on their side of the field.

Volleyball

-In the case of head-to-head matches or duals, A-M will allow immediate family and/or step family plus two additional fans for each member of the home and visiting team (each athlete). During a triangular and tournaments, as of now, A-M will permit immediate family and/or step family for each member of the home and visiting teams. This is subject to change throughout the season. Visiting teams will follow the same guidelines. These restrictions will apply to Junior Varsity and Varsity games this 2020 fall season.

-In regards to Junior High games, A-M will allow immediate family and/or step family only.

**Face coverings will be highly encouraged, but are not mandatory for home events.*

The Ansley Village Teacher Organization is teaming up with the staff and teachers at Ansley Public Schools to offer a supply of meals and snacks for children over the weekends or extended breaks, free of charge.
