NATIONAL CHERRY TURNOVER DAY



National Cherry Turnover Day on August 28th praises a tasty and sweet hand pie. These cherry-filled pastries are best enjoyed hot. However, like any pie, many eat them at room temperature, too. Add a dollop of whipped cream or a scoop of ice cream. No doubt your enjoyment will be doubled.

Cherry turnovers are a pastry made by placing a cherry filling on a piece of dough. The dough is folded over and sealed. Then, the individual turnovers are baked or deep-fried for a golden and flaky crust. Tart cherries make the best pies. Since they need added sugar to be palatable, their juices meld with the sugar when baking. The results are tasty perfection!

A turnover a single serving. They fit nicely in a hand, making them portable. Another name for turnover is hand pie. However, we recommend a fork and plate when eating them piping hot. Cherries on their own offer a bounty of nutrients. For example, the antioxidants in this red fruit protect cells from damage. Because cherries pack an anti-inflammatory punch, they may help reduce the risk of heart disease, too.

FUN CHERRY FACTS:

Related to plums, peaches, and nectarines, cherries are drupes or stone fruits.

Cherries were brought to North America in the 1600s by the English colonists.

There are more than 1,000 varieties of cherries in the United States.

There is an average of 44 cherries in one pound.

TRAEGER BREAKFAST SKILLET

INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 tablespoons butter
1 small onion, chopped (about 1 cup)
1 large potato, chopped (about 1 cup)
1/2 teaspoon salt
1-pound ground pork breakfast sausage
6 large eggs
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
1/2 cup heavy cream
1 garlic clove, minced
garlic chives for garnish (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat Traeger grill to 350 degrees F with lid closed for about 15-20 minutes.

In a large cast iron skillet, either over a stovetop or on the preheated grill, heat up butter over low-medium heat. Add chopped onion and potato, sprinkle with salt. Sauté until potatoes are becoming soft. Remove from skillet and set aside.

Add the pork sausage to the skillet and cook until no longer pink.

While the pork is cooking, prepare the egg mixture. In a large bowl, whisk the eggs, heavy cream, shredded cheese, and minced garlic.

Once the pork sausage is cooked, remove from heat and return the potatoes/onion mixture to the skillet. Combine together. Pour the egg mixture over top of the sausage and potatoes.

Place the skillet inside of the Traeger with lid closed and cook for about 40-45 minutes until the eggs are cooked through.

Serve & enjoy!

GOOD NEWS FOR ANSLEY RESIDENTS!! Orin Clinger has recently purchased the compost site and is willing to enter into an agreement with the Village for continued use of the site by Ansley residents for trees and compost materials. **NO LUMBER OF ANY TYPE WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SITE!** **The only materials that will be acceptable are trees and branches on the burn pile; leaves, grass, garden waste, dog waste and cat litter on the compost pile.** These are the only allowed materials in accordance with the Village's permit for the site.

The Department of Energy and Environment (formerly DEQ) is becoming stricter in their regulation of these sites and the Village is subject to a \$10,000 per day fine for not following the parameters of the permit. In other words, if they do a spot check on the site and find lumber, tires, carpet, or any other items not specifically allowed, even if the site is not burning, they will close the site immediately, can impose the fine, and require proof of proper disposal of the illegal items. This has happened on 2 prior occasions, but a fine has not been imposed yet. The \$6.00 per year residents pay for having the site available to use properly would in no way cover a fine. That would have to be assessed back to the taxpayers of Ansley. Hopefully having this information will prompt citizens to use the site properly. Also, if citizens see misuse of improper materials being dumped, they will report it so a citation can be issued to the offending party.

Your cooperation is important and necessary for continued availability of the site and to protect against the possibility of a hefty fine. Also, if you see Orin Clinger you might want to thank him for his generosity in stepping up to purchase the tract and agreeing to continue making it available to Ansley residents!

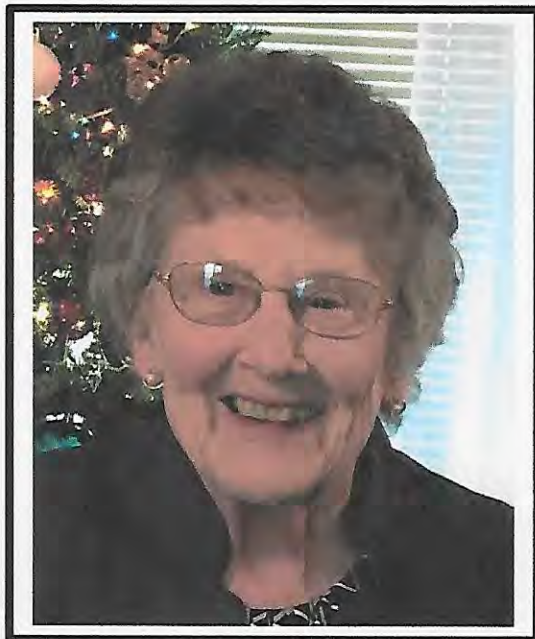
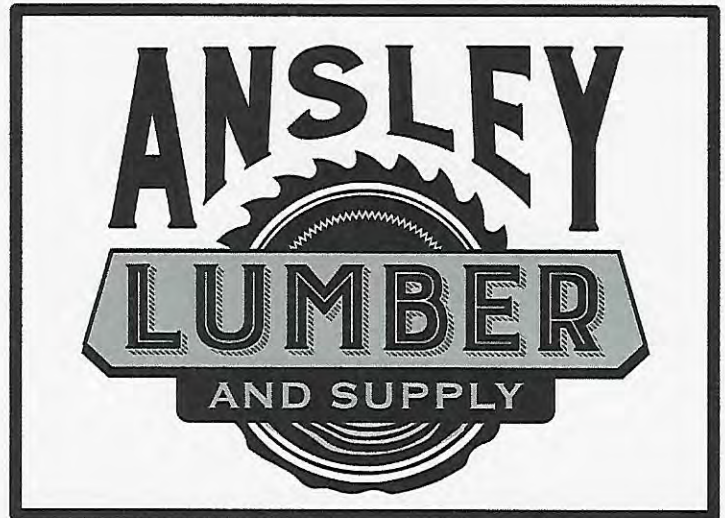
