NATIONAL DRIVE-THRU DAY



National Drive-Thru Day on July 24th recognizes an innovation conveniently going strong today. The drive-thru reached its iconic zenith in the 1950s but stayed strong through the 60s, 70s and beyond. People have enjoyed this service since the 1930s.

The ease of dropping off or picking up an item without getting out of the car may be something we take for granted. Of course, many studies point to the benefits and drawbacks associated with using the drive-thru.

The first and most obvious that comes to mind is the ease of dropping off or picking up and item. Whether it's the mail, a prescription or the dry cleaning, pulling up to a window or a slot and passing the article through is eminently easier than even finding a parking spot. Then, if we have children, we collect our children, our item and wait in line. After waiting, we usually search for our parking spot while juggling children and once again pile them back into the car. When multiple stops are involved, repeat the previous steps. Check the ease of use box. Secondly, many people think the drive-thru is faster. While that might be true at some locations, it will depend on the type of service, time of day, and where you are located. For example, a long line in the drive-thru at the bank may mean no waiting inside. The same may also be true at your favorite fast-food restaurant. However, if you only need to drop off a letter at the post office, use the drive-up option. Finally, accuracy tops the list of some drive-thru specialists. Again, this criterion is hit or miss. Depending on the type of business, time of day and location, accuracy varies. Interestingly, in 2018. Chic-fil-A mastered this arena with 97.3% accuracy.

TWICE BAKED POTATOES

INGREDIENTS

- 8 Medium russet potatoes
- 2 Cup hot milk
- 12 Tablespoon butter, melted
- 2 Tablespoon minced chives, optional
- 6 Strips cooked bacon, crumbled
- To Taste salt and pepper
- 2 Cup shredded cheddar cheese additional minced chives, for garnish

When ready to cook, set Traeger temperature to 450°F and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.

Scrub the potatoes under cold running water and pat dry with paper towels. Poke in several places with a fork.

Arrange the potatoes directly on the grill grate and bake for about 1 hr. and 15 minutes, or until the potatoes are cooked through.

Use oven mitts to transfer the potatoes to a rimmed baking sheet. Let the potatoes cool slightly for 5 to 10 minutes.

Reduce grill temperature to 375°F.

Cut the potatoes in half lengthwise, and scoop the potato flesh into a bowl leaving a 1/4-inch shell.

With a mixer, whip the potatoes on low speed for about 30 seconds. Slowly add the hot milk and melted butter. Increase the speed to medium-high and whip until the potatoes are fluffy and smooth, roughly 1-1/2 to 2 minutes.

Stir in the chives and bacon. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Lay the hollowed-out potato skins on a large baking sheet and fill each skin to heaping with the whipped potato filling. Top each potato half with a generous sprinkling of cheese.

Cook at 375°F for 20 minutes or until golden brown and cheese is melted.

Remove from grill and top with chives, if desired. Enjoy!





We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of Ansley Public School's plans for the 2020-2021 school year. At the July 13th School Board meeting, the Ansley School Board adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the safe and effective education of our students by our staff is the primary objective of Ansley Public Schools; and

WHEREAS, the educational experience provided by Ansley Public Schools is much deeper than that which can be provided through remote learning; and

WHEREAS, Ansley Public Schools respects the rights of parents to make decisions pertaining to their own children on issues such as wearing face coverings or gloves while in attendance at the school:

THEREFORE, let it be resolved that Ansley Public School will open fully and on-time for the 2020-2021 school year, without substantial changes to current policies and practices, unless mandated by the Governor of Nebraska or other official with actual authority to do otherwise; and

THEREFORE, let it be resolved that Ansley Public School will allow individual staff and students to make their own decisions based on their own circumstances regarding face coverings while on school property or at school activities, unless otherwise required or permitted by law.

With that being said, the school year for our students will begin on Monday, August 17th. 
