CHOICE GAS PROGRAM UPDATE.....

There will be changes in the Choice Gas Program for 2021 following a workshop held this summer with the Nebraska Public Service Commission and gas suppliers in the program, including ACE. The changes include extending the previous two-week enrollment period, which has traditionally been held during two weeks in April, to a **six-week sign up period**. The 2021 selection period dates have not been set but the six-week sign up period is more in line with the recommendation from the Public Service Commission. The other significant change will be the **elimination of delegation agreements**, which were used to enroll customers during the program's "pre-enrollment" period, which ran from January to April before the actual two-week selection period. The new six-week selection period will provide a better platform for head-to-head competition between suppliers. The "pre-enrollment" delegation agreements often led to confusion. Consumers sometimes received multiple proposals from the seven suppliers and ultimately were unsure who or even if they had signed up for the program. By eliminating the "pre-enrollment" period and delegation agreements this confusing process will no longer be used. More information will be provided next January and February as they finalize Choice Gas Program procedures and set definite dates for the 2021 sign up period. As always, the Village of Ansley will encourage residents to strongly consider **ACE** as their supplier. The Village is a member of ACE which gives us a representative to their Board and a vote in the operation of the organization. ACE has returned over \$24,000 to Ansley over the years as a member of the group and these funds have been used to purchase picnic tables, Christmas decorations and shades, umbrellas and chairs at the swimming pool.

NATIONAL CHEESEBURGER DAY



National Cheeseburger Day on September 18th honors America's favorite sandwich with a slice of cheese.

A few days ago, we celebrated National Double Cheeseburger Day. This food holiday is the lighter version. While only a single stack, this tasty burger still earns a celebration!

There are many theories to the beginning of the cheeseburger dating back to the 1920s. One story suggests that Lionel Sternberger invented the cheeseburger in 1926 while working at his father's Pasadena, California sandwich shop, The Rite Spot. During an experiment, he dropped a slice of American cheese on a sizzling hamburger.

However, like numerous iconic foods, many people and restaurants claim the origin story. For example, a restaurant in Los Angeles called O'Dell's placed the cheeseburger on their menu in 1928. It came smothered with chili – all for the price of a quarter. Kaelin's Restaurant in Louisville, Kentucky claims they invented the cheeseburger in 1934. One record that gives the Humpty Dumpty Drive-In in Denver, CO bragging rights is the trademark they received in 1935 for the name "cheeseburger." Another who applied for a trademark of that word was Gus Belt, the founder of Steak n' Shake. Sometime in the 1930s he also applied for the trademark. Despite all these claims, a couple of things are for sure. The cheeseburger checks all the marks for satisfying a craving, and the cheeseburger isn't going anywhere!

Family-Friendly Stuffed Cheeseburgers

Ingredients

1 cup chopped sweet onion
1/2 cup crushed saltines (about 15 crackers)
1 large egg
1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and minced
1 envelope ranch salad dressing mix
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 garlic clove, minced
1 teaspoon pepper
2 pounds ground beef
1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
1 jar (4-1/2 ounces) sliced mushrooms, drained
3 tablespoons cream cheese, softened
6 kaiser rolls, split

Directions

In a large bowl, combine the first eight ingredients. Crumble beef over mixture and mix well. Shape into twelve thin patties.

Combine the cheddar cheese, mushrooms and cream cheese; spoon onto centers of six patties. Top with remaining patties; press edges firmly to seal.

Grill burgers, covered, over medium heat or broil 4 in. from heat for 5-7 minutes on each side or until a thermometer reads 160° and juices run clear. Serve on rolls.

TRAEGER BBQ CHICKEN BREASTS

INGREDIENTS

4 Whole Chicken Breast

1/4 Cup olive oil

1 Teaspoon freshly pressed garlic

1 Tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

As Needed Traeger Fin & Feather Rub

1/2 Cup Traeger Sweet & Heat BBQ Sauce

1/2 Cup Traeger 'Que BBQ Sauce

STEPS

1 In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, garlic, Worcestershire sauce, and Traeger Fin & Feather rub. Cover chicken breasts with mixture.

2 In a separate bowl, combine equal parts Traeger Sweet & Heat and Traeger 'Que BBQ sauce.

3 When ready to cook, set temperature to 500°F and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.

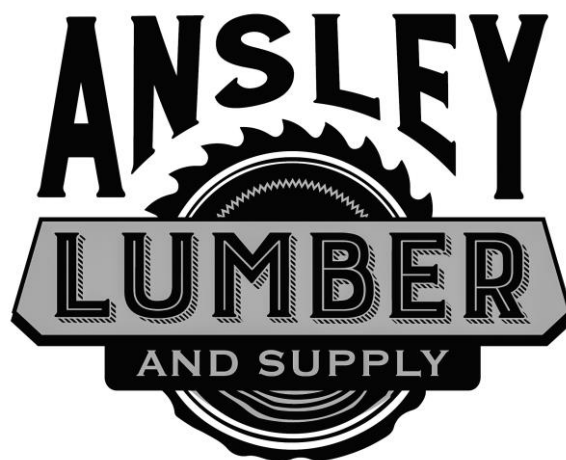

Financial Assistance Available for Landlord Relief to Address Losses Incurred by the COVID-19 Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic has affected nearly everyone in Nebraska, with lay-offs, furloughs, school closings, and more. The Central Nebraska Economic Development District is teaming with the Southeast Nebraska Affordable Housing Council (SENAHC) to help landlords.

Funding is available, only for the **next sixty (60) days**, through a Community CARES Grant from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) that includes \$800,000 for direct statewide landlord assistance. SENAHC is working with Nebraska's eight Economic Development Districts to distribute the financial assistance to qualified landlords. Eligible landlords are those who have **documented financial loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic** and **lease to low-to-moderate income tenants**. Both criteria must be met in order for the landlord to participate.

CARES financial assistance may be allocated to landlords in one of two forms, or in a combination of both. Regardless, landlords are only **eligible for up to \$10,000** in the form of a straight grant (no personal cash match or payback is necessary). Landlords may apply for up to \$2,500 in direct financial assistance to recoup lost rent or utility payments due to tenant's inability to provide a full payment after their employment was compromised as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Otherwise, landlords may apply for up to \$10,000 for minor rental unit rehabilitation. If both forms of aid are needed, it is possible to apply for up to \$2,500 in direct assistance and request additional funding for minor unit repairs, not to exceed \$10,000 total. Funding is available on a per-landlord basis, not per-unit. For example, landlords **cannot apply for multiple \$10,000 grants** to address several units; **only one rental unit per landlord** can be assisted with this program.

Judy Petersen, Executive Director of the Central Nebraska Economic Development District, is very excited about this unique opportunity: **"This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to assist landlords who have been impacted by COVID-19. We courage you to apply TODAY to ensure these funds are invested into our region."** The Central Nebraska Economic Development District serves the following counties: Blaine, Boyd, Brown, Cherry, Custer, Garfield, Greeley, Holt, Keya Paha, Loup, Rock, Sherman, Valley and Wheeler.
