#### Pre-inspection

The Village of Ansley's Community Open Burn Permit does not expire.

#### Arrival and Opening Conference

I, Phillip Halsted, arrived unannounced at the burn site at 12:50 p.m. on April 13, 2021. It was 47°F and partly cloudy with a 15 mph NW wind. The pile was not burning at the time so there were no visible emissions.

#### Observations

There was a sign saying "No Littering" at the entrance to the burn site. There were trees, brush, and untreated wood in the pile. Additionally, while inspecting the burn site I found treated and painted wood. Pictures of the prohibited items are included in the attachments of this report. I left the site at 1:00 p.m.

#### Exit Interview

I did not visit the Village office due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Dear Lanette Doane:

Enclosed is the Open Burn Permit for Village of Ansley. This permit only allows the burning of trees, brush and untreated wood. Burning such things as leaves and grass clippings, creosoted wood, treated lumber products, painted wood or building demolition materials is prohibited. An additional burn permit will be required from your local fire chief prior to burning.

Ash resulting from burning trees and untreated wood can be disposed of on-site. If your community burn site location changes, you will need to re-apply for another permit.

This permit is being issued without an expiration date. However, Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy (NDEE) staff may conduct inspections of the burn piles to determine compliance with the permit requirements. A violation of the permit or regulations can result in revocation of the permit and/or civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per day.
